Horsham – named by James Darlot, founder of Horsham in 1841 and named after his home town in England whose name was derived from 'Horse Village' meaning a 'village where horses are kept'

Wopet bungundilar – is the traditional Aboriginal name for Horsham, which means 'camp or house of feathers' and represents a campsite in Horsham and birthplace of the emu Tchingal killed by the Bram brothers. Our traditional owner groups are the Wotjobaluk, Wergaia, Jupagalk, Jaadwa and Jadawadjali people.

Horsham College was established in January 1994 following the merger of Horsham High School and Horsham Secondary College (formerly Horsham Technical School).
