Context:

1. The Accountability & Improvement Sub-Committee of School Council governs the Student Awards Policy.
2. Awards will be presented at an Awards Ceremony in the last week of Term 4:
 - Years 7 to 11
 - Year 12
 - Alternate Programs
3. All students are to wear their full school uniform to Awards Ceremonies.
4. All awards are to be approved by the Accountability & Improvement Sub-Committee of School Council, before they can be included in the Awards Ceremony.
5. Award winners from each year-level will be invited on stage and presented with their awards. Short citations, where applicable will be read out (no longer than 50 words).
6. Any proposed additional awards are to be submitted to the Principal no later than the end of Term 1 for inclusion in the relevant Award Ceremony.
7. The Accountability & Improvement Sub-Committee will review and possibly modify the format of the Award Ceremonies and awards included on an annual basis.
8. Horsham College welcomes award sponsorship by organisations and local businesses while reserving the right to determine the purpose for which awards are made. Non-specific awards sponsorship will be accepted in increments of \$75. Unless part of a recurring, titled award, vouchers will not be accepted as sponsorship.
9. Any cash prizes awarded will be strictly from businesses or organisations outside of Horsham College. All Horsham College funded awards will take the form of contributions towards school-based camps and/or excursions, or in the case of Year 12s, reimbursement for expenses related to further education in the 12 months following receipt of the award.

10. All **academic** award recipient names must be submitted to the Awards Coordinator by the first Friday in December. Recipient names for awards sponsored by organisations outside of Horsham College, and non-academic Horsham College awards, must be provided to the Awards Co-ordinator by the last Friday in November.

1. Encouragement Awards

Selection Procedure:	The successful student is selected by each sub school leader after requesting recommendations from level coordinators. Citation
Award:	\$75.00 credit on school account, and a certificate

2. Music Award – Junior

Sponsor:	Horsham College
Year Level:	Student from Year 7 to 9 (1)
Criteria:	This award is given to a student who learns an instrument or voice through the school and who performs in a school ensemble. The recipient intends to continue their musical education through the school in the following year.
Selection Procedure:	This award will be overseen by the Arts Learning Area Coordinator who will delegate the allocation of the award to the Music department. No citation
Award:	\$100.00 credit on school account, and a certificate

3. Carol Hale Memorial Award

Criteria:	This award is in honour of Carol Hale, former IT Manager, who consistently demonstrated outstanding care, support and advocacy for students and staff at Horsham College. Criteria:	Students eligible for this award must have participated in the Horsham College Musical Production as one of the cast, crew or orchestra members
Selection Procedure:	The Production Committee will be responsible for the final decision of this award. Nominations for the award will be received from staff involved with the production. Evidence will be collected and collated to ensure that the nominated student has satisfied the criteria. Citation

This award is given to a student in Year 9 who reflects and demonstrates Sue's exemplary leadership skills.
